Computer Tablets: our program of delivering computer tablets to homes without computers or without internet, so that folks can watch our services, is proceeding well! Once turned on, the video starts automatically. COVID-19 Update

The latest Pastoral Letter from Bishop Peddle, along with the document "Many Members, One Body," which outlines the procedures and precautions we need to follow in preparation for re-opening our churches to public worship, are both available through our website or from the Cathedral Office. We will make preparations during the Summer, with the hope of re-opening to public worship in September. In order to make these preparations and have the appropriate personnel available for each service, we will need several volunteers. There are various positions which will need to be filled: Facilitator, Greeter, Registrar, Sexton. Please read about these positions in the report, and if you are interested in volunteering, or have any questions, please contact the Rector directly: whalen_roger@hotmail.com. Ideally, these volunteers would not be part of our vulnerable population, meaning that they should be under 60 years old and not have any under-lying medical conditions which would make them particularly vulnerable in this situation.

The Cathedral Vestry will meet this week to set up a taskforce to implement the many recommendations and begin making preparations for re-opening.

Regarding worship in September, based on the guidelines from the Diocese, there are several things you need to expect:

- Worship will not look the same as it did in February;
- Service times will change;
- At least one service each Sunday will be available on-line;
- There will be no choir and no congregational singing;
- You will need to Pre-register for a service. You may not be able to just drop in for worship;
- There will be no Sunday School and no Coffee Hour.

One thing that will not change – no matter how we do it – we will still worship God together in love, and care deeply for each other and the world around us! More information about how we will handle the re-opening of the Cathedral to Public Worship will be shared in the coming weeks.

A note from the Rector:

Please know that the decision to wait until September was not an easy decision to make. We know that there are folks who are longing to get back to Church, and we feel the same way. There were two main considerations in deciding to wait: first, we wanted to make sure that we had time to prepare properly so that we can abide by the government regulations regarding places of worship; second, and perhaps even more important, the Clergy of the Diocese are very tired – it has been a difficult few months, as you are all aware. If we were to reopen now, most clergy (myself included) would not take their vacation time, and would not get the rest that they need and deserve. Please be patient with us as we take the time over the next two months to get some rest and to properly prepare for re-opening. I pray God's Blessing on you all, and hope to be able to see you face-to-face in September. Peace, Roger+
