**An announcement will be made tomorrow regarding  
a Memorial Service for Prince Philip here at the Cathedral.**

**Please note:** We are still operating under restrictions. There is a limit of 50 people allowed to attend in-person services. Once we allow for clergy, musicians, and volunteers, there will only be 35 people permitted to register for each service. All services will still be available on-line.

The 11 a.m. Sunday service will be both on-line and in-person. We will make some adaptations to the service, in order to comply with regulations. For example, the in-person congregation will only be permitted to sing the last hymn, but we will have other hymns for the people joining us on-line. We hope that the number of people permitted to attend will increase shortly after Easter.

**Sundays@Seven** will resume next week, April 18<sup>th</sup>, with A Service of Light. Registration will be available through Eventbrite.

**You must be Pre-registered for Public worship each week.**
