The Eighth Sunday after Pentecost

Updates: While we are now permitted to have 200 people present for services, we do still have to follow the same restrictions regarding seating, masking, and physical distancing. **You no longer need to pre-register**, but everybody still needs to check-in at the entrance and provide contact information. We will have a list of those who attend regularly and will sign in any others who join us. We will distribute hymn books, as well as Prayer Books, so you can follow along with the hymns, but we are still only permitted to sing the final hymn as a congregation. Those joining us on-line are welcome to sing all the hymns, of course.
