**Welcome to the Anglican Cathedral of St. John the Baptist**

**21<sup>st</sup> Sunday after Pentecost**

## **Land Acknowledgement:**

We respectfully acknowledge the land on which we gather as the ancestral homelands of the Beothuk, whose culture has now been erased forever. We also acknowledge the island of Newfoundland (Ktaqmkuk) as the unceded, traditional territory of the Beothuk and the Mi'kmaq. And we acknowledge Labrador as the traditional and ancestral homelands of the Innu of Nitassinan, the Inuit of Nunatsiavut, and the Inuit of NunatuKavut. We recognize all First Peoples who were here before us, those who live with us now, and the seven generations to come. As First Peoples have done since time immemorial, we strive to be responsible stewards of the land and to respect the cultures, ceremonies, and traditions of all who call it home. As we open our hearts and minds to the past, we commit ourselves to working in a spirit of truth and reconciliation to make a better future for all.

**Proof of Vaccination:** Starting on October 22<sup>nd</sup>, you must provide Proof of Vaccination in order to attend services and events here at the Cathedral. This can be in the form of the **Vaccine Passport**, in either electronic or paper version, or an official Proof of Vaccination form issued by the Government. This will be mandatory for everyone over the age of 12. Anyone disobeying this mandatory directive from the Government, including the leadership at our Churches, could face fines and other legal consequences. If you do not have Proof of Vaccination, then please worship with us on-line.
