First year students for Post-Secondary Education: Applications are now being accepted for the **Gerald & Doreen Facey Memorial Scholarship** to be awarded for September 2022. This scholarship is valued at **\$1,500** and will be awarded to a young person from the Anglican Cathedral Parish enrolled in his/her first year of post-secondary education (Private College, College of the North Atlantic, Marine Institute, Memorial University of Newfoundland, etc.). This scholarship will be awarded on the basis of academic achievement & involvement in Cathedral Parish. The selection committee will consist of The Dean and Wardens. Applications are available from the Church Office, and must be received in the Church Office on or before 4 pm on August 19th.

TipTap Pay machines are now set up in the Cathedral. We will use them for a trial period for a few months. These machines allow someone to simply 'tap' their credit or debit card to donate to the Cathedral. As we know, many people do not carry cash anymore, so this is a simple way to allow people to donate to the work and ministry of the Cathedral. The main intention was to have them available during the tourist season, but they can be used for a variety of purposes, including concert or event admissions, souvenirs, or even Sunday morning donations. To donate or pay, you simply 'tap' your card on either the \$5 or \$20 device. For folks who donate \$20 or more, there will also be a link where they can follow up to request a tax receipt.
