The Provincial Service of Commemoration for Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth will be held here at the Cathedral at 2 p.m. on Monday, September 19th. Members of the public are invited to attend, but space is limited, and seating will be done on a first come, first served basis. Invited guests and members of the public are required to be seated by 1:30 p.m. As parking is very limited, invited guests and members of the public are strongly encouraged to use public transit or be dropped off for the service. The service will also be live-streamed on our Cathedral Facebook page, as well as the Diocesan and Government pages.
