Harvest Thanksgiving: As usual at this time of year, we are asking anyone who is able and willing to come and help decorate the Cathedral for Harvest Thanksgiving. Members of the congregation are encouraged to contribute flowers and foliage for the decoration of the Cathedral, and to bring them along on the morning of Saturday, October 7th by 9:30 a.m. Because of the size of the Cathedral and the amount of decoration required, the more helpers we have, the better! For best results with cut foliage, we suggest that you cut your flowers/foliage on Friday and have it stand in water overnight. Donations of food (fresh vegetables, fruits, and preserves) will be gratefully received as well, and will be displayed as part of our Thanksgiving for God's many blessings. All food received will be distributed to Emmaus House and The Gathering Place.

Renovations have begun in the Transepts and Nave of the Cathedral. We expect work will continue for about 6 weeks, but there will be little, if any, disruption to our service schedule. This work will see the creation of wheelchair spaces in the centre nave aisle, an accessible washroom and a Labyrinth in the south Transept, a small kitchenette area in the North Transept, and new flooring throughout the main level of the Cathedral. Funding for this project comes from a Federal Accessibility Grant, the Harvey Clarke Capital Fund, and private donations.

The Office will be closed from Monday September 25th to Monday October 2nd, inclusive. Phone Messages and emails will still be checked daily.

Quilts @ The Cathedral is expanding, and will now be called Quilts, Hooked Rugs, and Stitching @ The Cathedral. This event will take place on November 3rd & 4th. Concerning the Holy Eucharist: The Sacrament is offered in both kinds – bread and wine. The receiving of both the bread and the wine (using the Common Cup) will be entirely your **choice**. The effectiveness of the Sacrament is not diminished by just receiving the Bread, as we have experienced over these past few years. The practice of intinction (dipping the bread in the wine) is not permitted in any form. If you do not wish to receive the wine, please indicate that to the Eucharistic minister by crossing your arms over your chest. Gluten-free hosts are also available upon request. We come up to the Altar Rail through the Lady Chapel and return through the organ tunnel. We will also bring the sacrament to you in your pew, if you are unable to come to the Altar Rail – please let one of the ushers know. Whether receiving in one kind or both kinds, all are welcome to receive the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist here in our Cathedral. If you do not wish to receive the sacrament at all, you may still come forward for a blessing. Please indicate this to the priest by crossing your arms over your chest.

Standing/Kneeling/Sitting: During our services, there is a traditional routine of standing, kneeling, or sitting for specific parts of the liturgy. Sometimes instruction is given, though most times it is obvious from the actions of the congregation. However, we recognize that not everyone can stand, kneel, or even sit for long periods of time. Please feel free to take whichever posture is comfortable, or even traditional, for you. If you have any concerns or questions about this, please contact the Dean.

Please note:

- The wearing of masks is optional here in the Cathedral.
 Please be respectful of others who may have a different practice with masks.
- We will continue to receive the Collection with a Collection Plate at the back of the Nave.
- Please be aware that our services are Live-streamed, so it is possible, from time to time, that you may be visible on our cameras.

<u>The Blessing of the Animals</u> is next Sunday, October 1st, at 3 p.m. All are welcome to come with their pets for this annual celebration of the animals in our lives.
